



Objectives


The festival aimed to involve mobile EU youth in discussions about their role in democratic processes and integration into local communities, fostering a sense of civic responsibility.



Key Activities and Outcomes 28/11

The first day of the event began with a warm welcome and an orientation session designed to set the tone for the upcoming days. Participants were introduced to the objectives of the festival, the agenda, and one another through icebreakers and team-building activities. Set against the serene landscape, the session introduced participants to digital tools for video creation, emphasizing how nature can inspire storytelling and visual narratives. Participants learned how to use simple filming techniques to capture the beauty of their surroundings, which could later be used to craft impactful digital content. Visit to the Byzantine Museum of Veria

EVALUATION

The evaluation of the event revealed that the combination of theoretical discussions on the first day and hands-on practice on the second day was highly effective in achieving the festival's goals. Theoretical sessions provided participants with a solid foundation in digital storytelling techniques, and civic skills. engagement, while the practical exercises allowed them to apply this knowledge creatively in real-world settings. The transition from structured discussions to immersive activities, such as video creation in nature and visits to cultural sites, enabled participants to connect abstract concepts with tangible outcomes. This approach fostered a deeper understanding of how digital tools can promote social inclusion and engagement. Feedback from participants overwhelmingly positive, with was many highlighting the balance of learning methods as a key strength of the program. They noted that this structure kept them motivated and inspired, reinforcing the value of experiential learning for fostering active citizenship and digital competency.

The youth festival in Veria successfully combined meaningful discussions, hands-on activities, and cultural exploration to empower participants with new skills and insights.
